The Rock County Alliance of Snowmobile Clubs (RCASC) is an organization of 9 concerned snowmobile clubs whose aim is to serve the needs of snowmobiling in Rock County. By uniting, the clubs have a stronger voice with city, county, and state government over issues concerning our sport.

The clubs in the RCASC are responsible for maintaining public state-funded trails, as well as a private club trail network for its members. There are approximately 226 miles of state-funded trails in Rock County which are maintained and groomed regularly by volunteer club members. Funds from the state along with donations and proceeds from club fund-raising activities help support the trails. The clubs in RCASC also promote the safety of the sport and support community activities.

RCASC produces a map of the private and state-funded trails in the county which is sponsored by area businesses and made available to everyone at local establishments.

All members of RCASC clubs belong to the Association of Wisconsin Snowmobile Clubs (AWSC), an organization of over 600 clubs with over 30,000 members throughout the state which work towards maintaining a state-wide trail system. Through the AWSC, snowmobilers have a voice in Madison to lobby for legislation concerning our sport. Without active snowmobilers in such organizations as RCASC and AWSC, the sport of snowmobiling in Wisconsin as we know it would not exist.

If you snowmobile in Rock County, you are invited to join one of the clubs listed. Come share the fun and camaraderie that exist only in a snowmobile club. For without these clubs and their active members, there would be no trails. For more information concerning the clubs in RCASC, please refer to the listings in this brochure.

What do Snowmobile Clubs do?

Snowmobile clubs provide us with the trails that we ride on. Without the clubs, there would be no trails. Their memberships are made up of snowmobilers like you and I who become volunteers that:

- *Talk to Landowners
- *Plan the layout for the trails
- *Pound in the stakes
- *Put up the trails signs
- *Brush the trail
- *Build bridges
- *Install culverts
- *Groom the trails
- *Work out trail problems
- *Remove the trails in the Spring
- *Provide Landowner appreciation activities
- *...And handle all the administrative work that goes with the above

Landowners & Snowmobilers ***** A Unique Partnership

Wisconsin snowmobilers are proud of the statewide trail system that ranks among the best in the nation. This trail system would not be possible without the generosity of the thousands of landowners around the state, which includes hundreds of landowners right here in Rock County.

Snowmobile club members work closely with their landowners in the placement of the trails. This cooperation results in the promotion of safe, responsible snowmobiling...and that's to everyone's benefit.
